Spotlight on Construction



Project Objectives

The objectives of the project will be to explore how we can make the most of the employment opportunities in the sector now and into the future by:

- raising the profile of the sector and of sector specific initiatives which support economic recovery
- highlighting career opportunities in the sector and ensuring that the relevant training is available for young people and adults to meet demands
- increasing skills for regeneration and net-zero

In the medium to longer term the objective of the project is to ensure high quality training and a range of skills for the construction talent pipeline in the Coast to Capital area.





Project Activities





1. Short term

- Share plans for construction spotlight and agreeing collaborative working
- Promote Construction Talent Retention Scheme (CTRS)
- Identify immediate opportunities in the construction sector to support the unemployed
- Work with providers to develop/expand construction retraining programmes for unemployed adults

2. Medium term

- Build and share a picture of the planned infrastructure construction programme in the Coast to Capital area over the next 5/10 years to understand the type and quantity of skills needed.
- Create a 'spotlight on construction' campaign across various media channels aimed at a range of age profiles (exemplar employers)
- Develop and/or promote (virtual) work experience/placement opportunities for young people and adults
- Promote and celebrate existing schemes e.g. apprenticeships/T Levels
- Develop an understanding of construction skills of the future including the Home Decarbonisation Academy and insight workshops.

3. Long term

 Work towards coordinated investment for training and workforce development across education and industry
